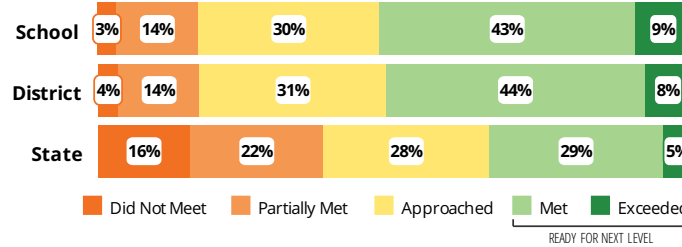

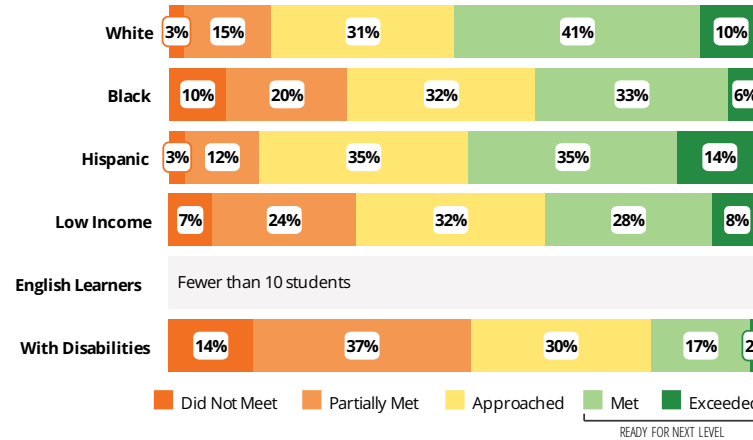
Academic Success

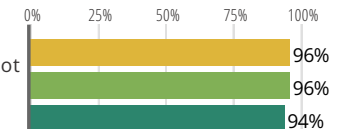

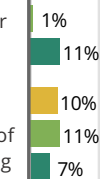
Attendance Rate

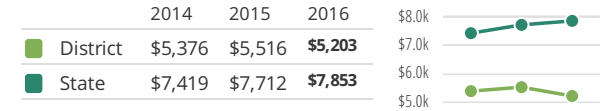

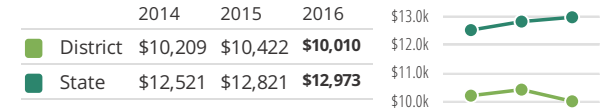
